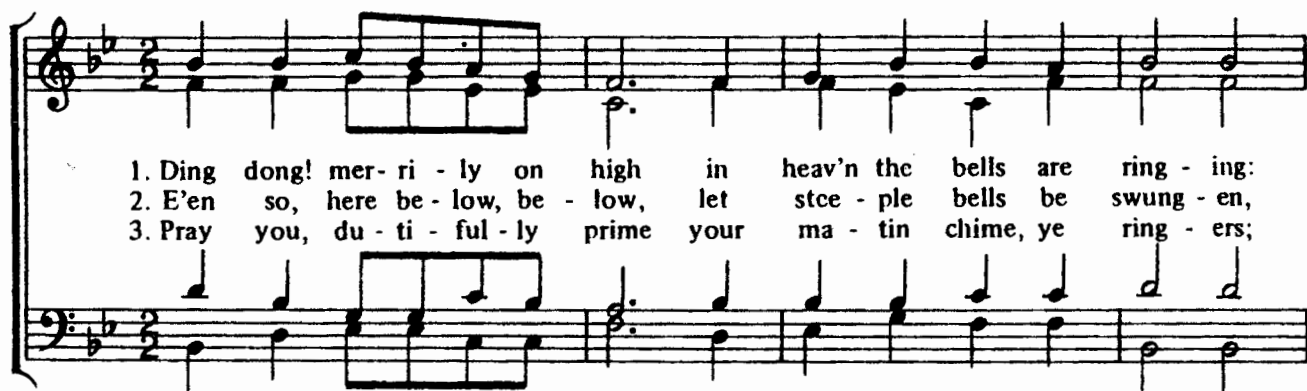


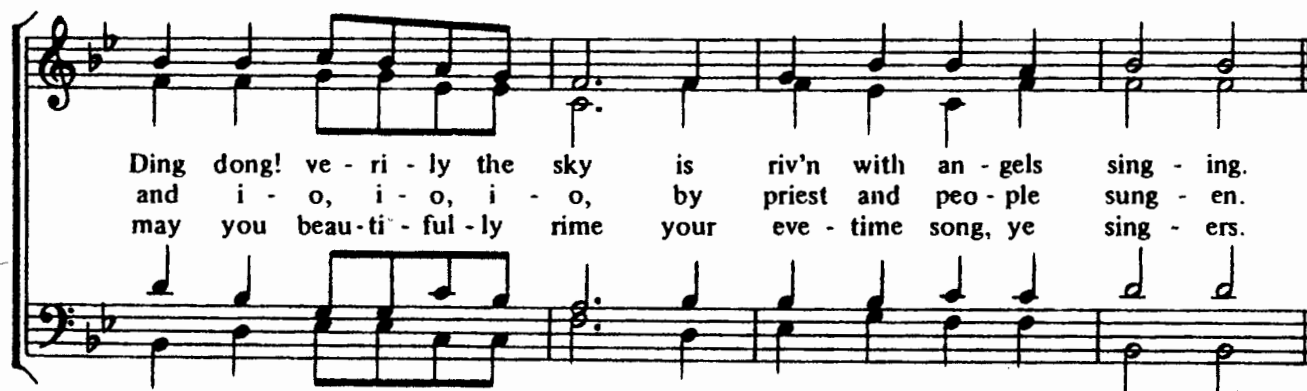
DING DONG! MERRILY ON HIGH
